



SCHOOL DAYS

We have practical clothes that we love to wear in the cool Fall and early Spring when we are going to school. On school days, I wear a plaid skirt and my little jacket and Scotch hat with my green felt purse over my shoulder, so I am really dressed for school, shopping or visiting. I have two other types of skirts. One has a darling belt line with a little silk blouse, and the other is a jumper skirt with straps over the shoulder. I think I like one as well as the other.

These were practical clothes that Terri Lee would wear in the cool Fall and early Spring to school. Three outfits for Terri are pictured under School Days. The first skirt is plaid and has a belt line that goes up in the front and forms a U. The blouse that came with my skirt is red. (1073 - Plaid Skirt and blouse). The second outfit is a jumper the suspenders are very thin. (1072 – Jumper Costume). Both come with a silk blouse. The last skirt is a plaid skirt, has a jacket in a solid color with covered buttons that match the skirt and a hat that also matches the skirt. This outfit also comes with a felt purse which the *Fashion Parade* tells us is green. (1071 – Scotch Costume).

The wool skirt came in many colors and Jerri also had trousers that matched. From 1948 – 1951 they would have been very short, in 1952 they became longer.

The September 1948 Jr. Magazine contained a half page article telling "Little Mothers" about Terri's school ensemble. Be on the lookout for plaid skirts, berets and covered buttons in matching fabrics! I also have a skirt in the same fabric as the first Terri pictured in the *Fashion Parade* that came with a blue jacket has a hat that matches the skirt, the buttons on the jacket also match the skirt.



First appearing in August 1954 as a coloring page. In January 1955 Terri Lee wearing the outfit announces her THRIFT CLUB. An article on the thrift club will be included. Finally in September 1956 the costume makes the cover of the monthly magazine with a coloring page.





The second picture in the 1952 *Fashion Parade* is a jumper and Blouse. The Fashion Parade calls it a jumper skirt with straps over the shoulders with a silk blouse. A clue to watch out for is if the jumper straps are lined with a color: Blue or Red. This will tell you that it should have a matching-colored blouse. This jumper also was made into trousers so Jerri could have a twin outfit as well.

The blouses come in several colors; the blue blouse has faded to purple over the years. Notice the different wool fabrics used.

The third picture is a skirt with what the *Fashion Parade* says has darling belt lines. It is nothing more than the skirt with a wide waist with the U cutout in the middle. There are so many versions of fabrics used it's a challenge to find them all.

Other advertisements is how we date our outfits and this skirt was featured in the January 1953 Monthly Magazine.



The skirt also comes in solid colors. Jerri's pants; the earliest version are the "short-short" as shown in yellow and the packaged blue set. The later version was longer as shown in pink. Terri Lee patterns cross the years and our only clue dating when an outfit was made is the clothing tag.

Terri Lee Associates announced one of the 2004 Editions would be Tiny Bonnie Lou & Benji Set. Item #90025 Ltd. Ed. 500 They were sold as a set and came together in a box to accomodate both dolls. They retailed for \$200.00. The outfits are made in a light-weight wool red herringbone. Tiny Terri Lee has on a hand knitted sweater. This is the first time "Tinys" were introduced in the ethnic dolls. They come with the walking mechanisms, just like the original Tiny Terri & Jerri Lee of the 1956s did.


The felt shoulder strap purse came in different colors with or without decorations glued on it.


Tiny Terri Lee wanted a felt purse like her big sister, Terri Lee. So here is a pattern for you to make her one. Enjoy.

Materials:

9" x 3" piece of felt
Small gripper snap
Thread

Instructions:

1. Matching (A) on the strap to (A) on the purse, stitch together using a blanket stitch.
2. Stitch from (A) to (B), going around bottom (C); then repeat on the other side. Cut out the pattern pieces.
3. At circles, add gripper snap for fastener, or you can use a sew on snap if you prefer.



A Hint for working with FELT

I guess most of us have noticed the moth holes in vintage Terri Lee felt fashions. The reason is they were made of wool felt. Today we can still buy wool felt but it is usually a combination of wool and rayon. I try to find felt that is 80% wool and 20% rayon; it is very soft and works up so well. I will add that 100% wool is very stiff and will not be easy in most cases.

In March of 2021 Terry Bukowski writes of the most elusively advertised 1957 Jerri Lee Baseball outfit. We had already known that the Terri Lee Doll Co. sponsored a Little League team named aptly the "Terri- Terrors," per the team pic.



In 2005 *Terri Lee Associates* offered #20036 *Jerri Lee Baseball*.



The first Little League teams created by Carl Stotz of Pennsylvania was founded in 1939. The first league had just three teams each sponsored by a local business. Per Wikipedia Little League was restricted to boys only until 1973.

The Fashion Parade for the Terri Lee dolls was a doll-world innovation! The little catalogue came in the box or tied to her wrist and contained pictures and ordering information for Terri's huge, ready-made wardrobe. Most--but not all--of Terri's outfits appear in one or another of the Fashion Parades.

As a collector you probably have many of these little booklets because you appreciate their value when you try to determine if an article is original or not.

A COMPLETE SET OF THE FASHION PARADES WILL NUMBER SEVEN.

Three versions were published while the company was in Lincoln, NE. After the move to Apple Valley, three more Fashion Parades were issued. One of them, the 1954 FP, also appeared with a special Christmas card cover stapled over the regular cover. Inside they were identical.

Remember: #1 is the short one. #2 has Gene Autry in it. #3 introduces the Patent Pending, unpainted Terri Lee dolls.

The cover of the 1952 Apple Valley Fashion Parade is identical to its 3 Lincoln predecessors. Of course, the address is different although an occasional '52 FP turns up with the Lincoln address stamped over. It does seem odd that the company used the same "Leading the Parade" picture. They were no longer producing painted dolls and Terri's majorette outfit had changed as well.

The 1952 FP is often found with a hole punched through one corner. The company began to tie the booklet to Terri's wrist where "Little Mother" would be sure to find it. The tiny catalogues were a great sales tool and the company started to include other leaflets: Linda's brochure, a retail price list, an invitation to join the Terri Lee Friendship Club, a list of "Fashion Centers," stores which carried a larger assortment of Terri Lee items, so that "big" mothers could place their orders by mail.

Inside, the color photos showed an up-dated wardrobe. Some outfits were from their Lincoln days but were pictured in a FP for the first time: Heart Fund, Irish Colleen, lace wedding gown, groom, ballet-length bridesmaid, doctor, nurse, etc.

The back of the '52 FP was very different. Previously, the "Lifetime Guarantee" had appeared there. In '52 it moved inside to page 2. Clothing & clothing storage took over the back cover. This was a good move since the well-being of the company depended on vigorous fashion sales.

How complete an inventory are these various FPs? Well, up to 1956 almost all of the outfits were shown either in a FP or monthly magazine. Then the magazines began to appear irregularly and there were no further FPs. This explains why in the last years outfits appear on price lists but are never pictured.

"LEADING THE PARADE" appeared in a new version on the cover of the black & white Fashion Parade of 1954. With 48 pages, it is the longest of the fashion booklets. The Terri Lee company was at its apex!!! This FP included Linda, her furniture and her layette. There is also a bed and a walker for Terri.

The layout of the black and white cover is still very similar to the preceding 4 FPs. However, there is a new, registered trademark signature and a new company name.

Some FPs in 1954 were mailed with an additional Christmas card cover. It was stapled over the black & white cover. Aside from the extra 4 pages, the two booklets are exactly the same.

TERRI LEE & DAUGHTERS in 1955. This family photograph first appeared in a Christmas card that the company sent out in 1955. Terri Lee was 28, Connie Lynn 9 and Linda 7 in this picture. Connie Lynn is holding the Linda doll...and the story goes that the Linda doll was named after Vi's youngest grandchild, Linda, but modeled with inspiration from Connie Lynn's baby pictures. Connie Lynn did get a doll named after her in 1955, but that doll is supposed to have been influenced by Linda's baby pictures...

"MEET THE TERRI LEE FAMILY," a 40-page, black & white issue with a color cover, was the 7th and final Fashion Parade. This last booklet showed shortie pajamas, drop-waist dresses, Curtsy coats. But what else was happening in Apple Valley which would soon lead to the end of the company there?

Between 1955 & 1957 the Terri Lee company expanded in an amazing way! There were seven new dolls: Connie Lynn (1955), Little Coco (1955 but unsuccessful), Tiny Terri Lee (1955), Tiny Jerri (1956), the Chicano dolls (19??) and So Sleepy (1957). There was a newly built production plant which increased floor space from 10,000 to 38,000sq. ft., a 300% increase! In April, 1957 the company took out a \$230,000 loan although by April, 1958 they were being sued for non-payment of wages. November 20, 1958 a fire burned out much of the new plant. Soon after that the company closed. By May, 1960 everything including the ranch home had been auctioned off. A combination of over-expansion, under-capitalization and poor management ended the Apple Valley endeavor.

Hindsight is a wonderful thing! What if...Vi Gradwohl had continued to have those great "new era in merchandising" ideas? What if...Vi had arranged to advertise Terri Lee on TV during Saturday morning cartoons the way the makers of Chatty Cathy did? What if...Vi had switched from "Fashion Centers" and middle-men to direct, mail-order catalogue sales the way the Pleasant Company has done with their "American Girl" dolls? What if...

Terri Lee Fashions for the tiny Terri DOLL by Pat Rather

* THE FIRST CATALOGUE:

In 1955 & 1956 the Terri Lee company created two new catalogues to show off the wardrobe of their new line of Tiny Terri Lee dolls.

The first catalogue, "PRESENTING TINY TERRI LEE," appeared in the fall of 1955. It showed 32 outfits and all of them were for Tiny Terri. This catalogue probably came out at about the same time as the new doll did. Tiny Terri was released to the public at an Apple Valley debut in November of 1955.

The first catalogue was also used as a kind of wrist tag for Tiny Terri. (See our pages on WRIST TAGS.) Its minuscule size is to scale with the doll. Booklets once tied to the doll's wrist will have a hole in the left, upper corner.

The first catalogue also substituted for the December, 1955 monthly magazine.

Instead of sending out that last magazine of the year, the company sent a clever Christmas card. It opened to show Santa with a pack. In the pack was a removable Tiny Terri catalogue inserted through a slit in the paper. (See our pages on the magazines.)

* THE SECOND CATALOGUE:

The second catalogue was also called, "PRESENTING TINY TERRI LEE." It was copyrighted in 1956. It shows about 60 outfits for Tiny Terri and 14 or 15 for Tiny Jerri.

The second catalogue does not seem to have been used as a wrist hanger.


Tiny Terri and Jerri fashions were also advertised in the

October 1956 monthly magazine. The pictures are identical; however, they were not as easy to see. The paper used in the monthly magazine was of a poor quality.

The veil has a cap of netting with the netting three fourths in length, what is interesting is that the lace trim

Tiny Terri Lee burst onto the market in November 1955. With not much time for the 1955 Christmas season, quick marketing was employed. Given the need to meet this rush

the November 1955 Terri Lee Monthly News Bulletin sent to the dealers featured Tiny Terri Lee as a reduced picture of Terri Lee. The doll could not have been tested or bullet #4 never would have been stated.

The Swiss fiber wigs of the curled hair Tiny Terri's did not permanently hold its curl. Not all dolls have the painted side eyelashes. Were they left off as an oversight to meet the Christmas rush or was there a cost savings measure employed during the 60s when the company went through so many changes?





Advertised in the 1954 Fashion Parade on page 41 number L-11 is “Everything For Linda” with a cost of \$10.95. Or just the empty suitcase LF-61 could be purchased at a cost of \$2.95. Everything for Linda included a blanket trimmed with satin ribbon, fancy pants, kimono, taffeta coat, dress, slip, creeper set, nightie, shoes & socks. The suitcases were originally made with Linda Lee at the bottom. A sudden shift from Lee to Baby forced the company to come up with innovative ways to sell the inventory on hand.



Above is a pink version, the color on the suitcase doesn't show up well. There is also a white top with a red lower as pictured below. A flower was glued on top of the Lee and in the case below it was peeled off or was never there.

If Terri Lee could have a bed, Little Mother could have a LAMP!

The lamp is a very light weight affair! The fiber glass shade is laced with gimp, a plastic covered cord popular in the 1950's for children's craft items. It perches on top of the base on three metal legs.

The base is a light metal frame designed to hold a rolled photograph of the doll. In SEPTEMBER 1955 the monthly magazine advertised the lamp, #5916 "Terri Lee Lamp, for \$13.95. It appeared in the 1956 "Fashion Parade" as #1890 at \$10.95.

Even though the bulb is only 7.5 watts, it was still too hot and too near the photograph. Its heat dried out the picture. That is probably why so few have made it into the 1990's.

In NOVEMBER 1956 and in JANUARY 1957 the monthly magazine advertised the lamp as "Terri or Jerri Photo Lamp." Either no one was paying any attention, or the lamp was just too ephemeral for only three have turned up, all with Terri's picture with some variation in color.
