



Thank you, Wanda, for being a friend and opening your home once again to play dolls.



This black & white picture is the earliest picture we have of the lame' skater. This skating outfit is made of silver lame' lined with ice blue satin and trimmed with tufts of fur. Early lame' is much more lustrous than later fabric. White leatherette skates complete the outfit.

The picture to the right is from the



collection of Wanda Houck and was featured in Peggy Casper's book *Fashionable Terri Lee dolls* see page 40. "It is made of silver lame' lined with ice blue satin and trimmed with tufts of fur. White leatherette skates were later

replaced by metallic ones in pink, gold, and silver.

Above 1948 Fashion Parade

Item #1080 in 1948 and then #3560G in 1952 Listed as a 2-piece dress, bodice to midriff, gored circle skirt with matching panties and pointed hat. This is the most common of skating outfits and surprisingly was available for only 3-4 years. This was during the phenomenal growth period of the Terri lee Doll Co.

Initially produced in the finest Brocades of blue, yellow, and white and followed with silk. Threaded lame' and solid lame'. These were advertised and sold until 1954 when the Princess style dress came into vogue.

No expense was spared when these were made. Lined with contrasting taffeta or satin and trimmed with perfectly matched ribbon. The Brocades and Silk Threaded Lame' are correctly dressed on a painted plastic and patent pending doll.

Roller skating and ice skating are very good sports for children because they help them to grow up healthy and graceful. My roller skating costume is of nimon and ruffled net, with matching bonnet. My ice skating costumes are very beautiful, and your eyes will sparkle when you see them. They are gold and silver lame, lined with satin or taffeta, and have hoods to match. Both my roller and ice skates have silver bells on them, and make a very pretty tinkling sound when I skate.

The 1952 Ice Skater still has the same look as the 1948 version. Made of gold or silver lame' they are lined with satin or taffeta. The colors shimmer while on the doll. Common colors are gold, silver, blue, and pink. Two lame fabrics are used. The blue outfit as well as the skater on the left has silver dots while the skaters below right have white lines through the fabric.

Advertised to be lined with satin or taffeta, the four piece skating outfit has rabbit fur on both the hat and top.



In 1956 another version of the Ice Skater costume was introduced using the same pattern as the 1954 outfit. Only the fabric has been replaced with a transparent lame with red with gold or blue with silver stripes through the fabric.

Terri Lee is featured on the Jan 1955 Monthly Magazine Cover while both Terri and Tiny Terri Lee are featured skating in the January 1956 Monthly Magazine.

The MIB #1366 sold for \$5.95 and came complete with skates.

Ice Skating Hats

The ad's in Junior Magazine do not show any ice skating costumes nor does the Terri Lee Company ad in Toys and Novelties magazine of 1947. The Lincoln Nebraska Fashion Parade shows two versions of an Ice Skating Costume on page 21. One is silver lame and the other taffeta brocade. Both have the same pointed hat with fur trim at the sides and ribbon those ties under the chin. The doll shown at the left

wears a white satin brocade costume with the same hat trimmed in fur. The ribbon at the chin is two-toned pink on one side and blue on the other side which can be found on other Lincoln clothing. The hat at the right is a rose colored version of the taffeta brocade ice skating costume shown in the early Fashion Parade. Please send me pictures of other fabrics or colors of this costume that you have on your dolls.



The 1952 Apple Valley Fashion Parade introduces a new lame Ice Skating costume still pictured with white ice skates. YoursTerriLee believes that the gold and silver skates were introduced about this time. Many versions of the Lame costume are found in silver, gold, red, and blue lame with various shades of lining. The hat is still pointed with fur trim at the ears. One could make a separate collection of just the lame skating costumes. The ice skating costumes are among the most glamorous costumes available for Terri Lee.



Red and blue lame Ice skating outfits in the 4-piece style may have been offered at a later time since some have been found with collections of other later costumes. The Silver lame Ice



skater on the right has pink foil ice skates.

In any case by 1954 the fashion Parade is showing a new style of Ice skating outfit which is only 3 pieces and had a different style hat. The new hat is more of a cap and is made from the same pattern as the new bunny fur hat which accessorizes the short velveteen coats.

The red and blue lame 3 piece Ice Skater costumes are adorned with red felt hearts both on the skirt of the costume and the hat. The skates are most often silver foil ice skates. In



1956, another version of the Ice skater costume was introduced using the same pattern as the red or blue lame with hearts but this time the fabric is a beautiful sparkly transparent lame with gold, silver and red or blue stripes. This costume also has red felt hearts as decoration. The skates are gold or silver foil. All costumes have matching panties.



The Tiny Terri Lee doll was presented in 1955 and had an Ice skating costume that matches big Terri Lee's except for the hat. It is not the cap style but is a pointed style like the older hats. The fabric is transparent lame in silver, gold, and blue or red with red felt hearts as trim. The skates are silver foil.

Several collectors have found Tiny Terri Lee dolls dressed in red

felt Ice Skating costumes which this reporter feels were made by an independent seamstress using left over felt skirts and not sold by the Terri Lee Company. The costume is not made in the quality that Violet Gradwohl would have approved.



About 2004 this reporter worked with the Aston Drake Company in producing a gold lame reproduction Terri Lee. The final product was actually quite a nice doll with a lot of attention to fine detail. For instance the multipiece circular skirt was copied exactly instead of creating a one piece circular skirt which would have been a lot easier and less expensive. The hat and the costume were copied from a 1952 style lame costume. The very dark wig used on this doll is a stunning contrast with the gold lame.

TINY TERRI LEE ICE SKATER

The 1955 and 1956 Tiny Terri Lee Fashion Parades offer only one style of ice skating outfit for Tiny Terri Lee. The outfit comes in two fabric color choices. The bright lame fabric has threads of silver, gold, and red or silver, gold, and blue running through the fabric. The outfit comes with matching panties. Silver ice skates complete the outfit.

Big Terri also has the same outfit only her hat is a different style. For a detailed description of Ice Skating, hats see the February 2010 article by Sandy Dorsey. Tiny Terri's hat is like the hats of the Lincoln NE area, with more of a pointed or cone shape than the skullcap of matching big Terri. At the bottom of the skirt and hat are two red felt hearts.



Tiny Terri's Unique Skating Costume

A favorite outfit of Tiny Terri's is her #3333 felt skirt with appliqued flowers and an organdy blouse which she wears for dress up occasions.

The outfit sold for \$2.19 in the mid 50s when it was introduced. The felt flower color varies. Dark pink, light pink, turquoise, light blue, royal blue and purple can be found along with green leaves. This flower and leaf decoration adds eye appeal to the felt skirt. Usually two leaves and the flower are fastened on by using one gold brad. Occasionally you may find a skirt with a flower and one leaf. Two separate brads are utilized with this format.

The most common skirt color seems to be red. Royal blue is found but not as abundantly. Big Terri had a matching outfit again in red and royal blue.

Felt was a favorite fabric for doll companies to use in the 50s for doll costumes since it required no hemming or seam finishing. They were simply following current fashion trends of the time. The felt "poodle skirt" craze was alive and well!



There lies a mysterious outfit in Tiny Terri's wardrobe however. The felt skirt coupled with another felt skirt becomes a one piece costume. I found Tiny Terri wearing it at a doll show 15 years ago. She had can-can panties and rayon socks and white plastic shoes on with it. After some speculation, she came to live in our collection. Was it a quirky outfit someone had cobbled together? A few years later we saw another one in a fellow collector's cabinet. It too, was red, both had the Terri Lee tag. Had a factory worker played around trying to experiment in making a new garment from two felt skirts?



As fate would have it, Wanda Houck and I emailed about felt skirts recently and she sent pictures of an ever more complete ensemble! Her outfit even has red felt panties and a felt hat modeled much like the skater hats - Wanda found hers 20 years ago and it had ice skates. That made sense - a skater outfit! Perhaps the panties and hat for our outfit had been long lost and this five piece set was how it had been originally offered. Of course, no official TL photos of this outfit have ever surfaced and some collectors dismiss these outfits as not being really authentic. Wanda's complete set now sways my vote toward this being a very unique and authentic skating outfit for Tiny Terri. What do you think?


In 2003 Ashton Drake signed an agreement with Terri Lee Associates to purchase four Terri Lee dolls which they used to re-create classic outfits from the Terri Lee Fashion Parade. Winter With Terri Lee #37135 sold for \$129.99. Ashton Drake meticulously copied the vintage Terri Lee four-piece gold lame ice skater outfit. The outfit is from 1951. Using the dark blonde Terri Lee they dressed her in the following:

- Gold lame panties with two square side snaps
- Flared sleeve top with one square snap fastened in the middle (pink & white Terri Lee tag inside)
- Pointed gold lame cap which ties with gold lame ribbon
- Circular skirt with one square snap in back

All four pieces are lined with pink satin and real white bunny fur accents were glued onto the top and on each side of the cap. Gold leatherette lace up ice skates with two rhinestones at ankle level were used for the footwear. Terri also wears textured white/gold panty hose.

Original vintage Ice Skater Hat

Materials:

$\frac{1}{4}$ yard of main focus fabric

red felt

$\frac{1}{4}$ yard lining, tulle is used


2/3 yards ribbon

thread

Instructions:

1. All seams are $\frac{1}{4}$ ".
2. Cut on fold, one focus fabric and one lining.
3. With right sides together sew the back seam of focus fabric and the lining, leaving a 1 inch opening in the lining (for turning the bonnet right side out).
4. Cut two ties from the ribbon 12" long. Baste in place at the "XX" of the hat. Fold the ribbon toward the inside so it will hang to the outside when finished.
5. Place the two pieces right sides together and sew around front and bottom.
6. Turn right side out and hand close the opening on the lining.
7. Cut a heart out of the red felt and glue to stitch on the corner of the hat.

Little Mother Sews Ice Skating Pants for Tiny Terri Lee



Original vintage Ice Skater Pants

Materials:

$\frac{1}{4}$ yard of main focus fabric

$\frac{1}{8}$ " elastic

$\frac{1}{4}$ yard lining, tulle is used 1 small snap

thread

Instructions:

1. All seams are $\frac{1}{4}$ ".
2. Cut on fold, one focus fabric and one lining.
3. With right sides together stitch along waist, back seam from waist to "X", and each leg opening.
4. Turn right side out.
5. Sew a 1" piece of elastic to each side of waist. Stretch the elastic as you sew.
6. With right sides together, stitch back seam from crotch to the "X".
7. Match front crotch to back crotch and sew a seam.
8. Turn right side out and sew a snap at the back.

From 1949 – 1953 the ice skates are made from white oil cloth, shown in the Fashion Parade the silver bells are attached to the first lace. They came with the outfit or you could purchase them separate #1078 for 60 cents.

In 1954 – 1956 it is noticeable in the Fashion Parade the skates have changed to the metallic skates that are commonly found. The Fashion Parades don't mention that the skates have a metallic covering or that they come in silver or gold. The metallic covering didn't hold up well over time.



1963 Ice Skater Knitted Pattern

In 1963 Sue Peck offered a Dolls Knitting & Crochet Book. Four dolls have perfectly scaled outfits to include our Terri Lee. Not only did I knit Terri's ice skater outfit but used the same pattern for Jerri only changed the skirt to shorts

for his outfit. This is Jerri's only chance to have an ice-skating outfit and it will match Terri's.

A - 138

This set will fit many sizes by knitting sleeves and body to desired length.

Baby wool, 3 ply (1 oz.).

Size 1 knitting needles.

Starting at neck cast on 72 sts. K 1, P1, for 1 in.

Change to different color yarn for stripe. K 19, Y O, K 1, Y O, (seam) K 8, (sleeve) Y O, K 1, Y O, (seam) K 20, (front) Y O, K 1, Y O, (seam) K 8, (sleeve) Y O, K 1, Y O, (seam) K 13, (front) (extra sts on one side of back are for placket). Purl 1 row.

Continue these two rows increasing at seams on right side, on every 7th row changes color of yarn for stripes.

SLEEVES—Knit stitches of right back and place on holder, knit right sleeve stitches, then sts of front on holder, attach other end of yarn & knit left sleeve stitches, place left back sts on holder. Knit both sleeves at same time to desired length.

K 2 sts tog 6 times across each sleeve before starting cuffs.

CUFFS—K 1, P 1, for 1 inch, bind off & sew sleeves under arms. Place sts of body on needles and knit stockinet st to within 1 in. of desired length. Make ribbing by K 1, P 1, for 1 in. and bind off.

CAP—Cast on 8 sts, place marker between each st, (7 markers). Inc in 1st stitch & after each marker across row. Purl 1 row. Continue these 2 rows & change color of yarn on every 7th row. At end of 2nd stripe drop markers.

Make ribbing of K 1, P 1, for 1 inch, bind off & sew cap tog. Make pompon for top.

MITTENS WITH THUMBS—These mittens will fit dolls from 10" to 20".

Use 3 ply baby yarn & No. 1 needles.

Cast on 34 sts.

CUFFS—K 1, P 1, for 8 rows.

BEADING—K 2, * Y O, K 2 sts tog, repeat from * across. Purl 1 row.

THUMB—K 16, inc in next 2 sts, K 16, Purl 1 row. K 16, inc in next st, K 2, inc in next st, K 16. Purl 1

A - 138

row. K 16, inc in next st, K 4, inc in next st, K 16. Purl 1 row. Continue until there are 8 sts for thumb.

Finishing Thumb—K 16 sts & place on holder, K 8 sts (thumb) turn & P back across thumb sts. Next row —K 2 sts tog across row, break yarn & pull back thru remaining sts of thumb, sew thumb tog.

Place the 16 sts on holder back on needle & join yarn at base of thumb & K across. P back across.

K in stockinette st for 8 rows, or length of doll's hand, K 2 sts tog across row, break yarn & pull back thru remaining sts. Sew mitten tog. Crochet chain & run thru beading. Make other mitten same.

I only see Jerri #1580B wearing the holster & gun cost \$18.95



Cheerleaders

What a surprise to discover that the Terri Lee Cheerleader outfit did not make an appearance in a Fashion Parade until 1954 (cover photo only) yet the Drum Major outfits were on the cover of every Fashion Parade with the exception of 1956. Oh My! This may very well be a short article! Let's just see what I can make of this great knitted sweater outfit as I know there must be more to discover!

Random thoughts and observations:

- 1) To begin with the initial Fashion Parade photos always show the Terri sweater, a sweater with a cable knit, having a solid color heart with an initialed "T" on it. I have never come across a sweater with a **solid color heart with a T**; have you? I have seen Terri's and Jerri's sweaters with a single T or J, but not with a heart shaped background. Was this a prototype not ever placed into production?
- 2) The description in the 1954 catalog ...*costumes, with initialed wool sweaters, and we even have a pennant to carry...* The photo only shows a pennant with a T that both Terri and Jerri hold. Where is the pennant with a J?
- 3) After scanning through all Fashion Parades, Monthly Booklets and price lists; Finally solid confirmation – a **1954 Price list** with catalog numbers that match the inside front cover of the 1954 Fashion Parade.
- 4) Knits were difficult to slip over a dolls head, was this why they were not introduced as a Cheerleader until 1954? Most hand knits previously were buttoned cardigans. Had there been difficulty or complaints with those wonderful Hand Knit outfits of the early years? Clumsy little Mothers/Fathers hands just were not adept at dressing their doll without totally messing up the hair.
- 5) October 1954 Monthly Magazine introduces our first cheerleader

1954 Cheerleaders

October 1954 - Cable knits! What a wonderful beginning! Football season has begun. Both Terri and Jerri wear what appears to be Yellow Cable knit sweaters with the initial's "T" or "J". Both also wear the hard formed Beanie hats of felt plus white scalloped oil cloth shoes.

The Cheerleader colors seem to be the basic: red, green, yellow and blue. Occasionally we see an initial T or J on an early hand knit sweater that this writer believes were the initial offerings for the cheerleaders that may have been slow selling items from years prior.

Thanks to both Glenda Kitto (yellow pair) and Sue Nast (blue and pink O/F) for their correctly dressed 1954 dolls.



Now let's discuss some dual purpose initialed cabled sweaters. This pair of Jerri's in their pale blue and bright pink are worn with the rare matching knit short pants. This writer believes they can also have a dual purpose and can be worn with the white botany wool long pants to become a Cheerleader Outfit.

When worn on a Painted Plastic or a Patent Pending this sweater needs to have the matching knit shorts.

If worn with botany wool slacks it should be on a 1954 or later hard plastic doll.

There is no way this writer would pair these hard-to-find sweaters with botany wool slacks if the matching short pants are at hand. But if I were lacking the short-knit pants my sweater would be matched with botany wool slacks on a '54 era doll. Like in the example shown from the Kitto collection the Terri sweater was matched with the Jerri shorts. These combos are just too hard to find. Sometimes we improvise.


However, the September 1956 MB presents the Tiny Terri and Tiny Jerri in **their popular Jersey sweaters with initials**.

My question now is just when were the non-cabled machine knit Cheerleader sweaters made???

No documentation via sketches in Monthly booklets, price lists, Or Fashion Parades have photos or descriptions telling us when the non-cabled initialed Cheerleaders were for sale. So where do we go from here???

1955 – 1956 Cheerleaders

Now how to answer this new question of WHEN the non-cabled sweaters were made or connected with a year, I go to my photo bank from all the collections I've seen...



What I know is that the gold boxes can be dated to: 1954. It matches with a price list of 1954 with this stock number of 4540W.

At least this is an identifiable fact.

This writer believes that as the hand-knit cabled sweaters were sold out they went to a machine knit style but with no cable. An assumption on my part.

Cabled VS non-cabled



Texture of wool is different between the two sweaters. The styles are different with the non-cabled green style appears to be a more uniform knit.



I am going to place another stake in the ground and say that the non-cabled style replaced the older cabled version and **IS** a 1955 – 1956 version. This was the MEGA years for the Terri Lee Doll and with the majority of outfits found in all of our collections it has to be that it is a 1955-1956 version even though all the literature shows a photo as a cable knit.

From old photos copies from eBay, I located another boxed Cheerleader. This one is in a pink clothing box. Catalog # 3540W @ \$3.95 is associated with the 1954-1955 price lists



So, to review we discovered 3 Cheerleader variations:

- 1) Wool Cable Knit sweaters
- 2) Wool Non-cable machine knit sweaters
- 3) Wool Jersey sweaters



All have monogrammed felt initials, all have white beanies, most have white scalloped shorts, some have white boots.

Jerri and Tiny Jerri wears long botany wool slacks


