



In 1948 Terris sleepwear is advertised in the May issue of Jr. magazine #4003 is Terri's boudoir set. (Right picture) This first set includes a nightgown, bed jacket, and bedroom slippers. The nightgown is white batiste, has long sleeves, lace and satin ribbons. The bed jacket is silk crepe, it comes in blue or pink. Notice the detailing on the bed jacket, the yoke and the sleeves are set in. The bedroom slippers have a satin bow on top.



Fine white batiste nightgown, trimmed in Val lace and satin ribbons. Silk crepe bed jacket, pink or blue. White felt slippers. **Complete, \$3.50, postpaid.**



The slippers are white felt with double-sided stain ribbon bows. This pair is pink and blue. If you look carefully these slippers are visible in the 1948 – 1951 Fashion parade picture.



The Nites have a solid batiste inset yoke with Val Lace trim. The matching PJs. A Nitie or PJs listed for \$1.75ea; Bed Jacket and felt slippers \$4.95/set.

A second “fashionable” nightie was issued in 1952, which was the Satin gown. No documentation comes with this gown other than they have a printed tag. Made in the same style as the Batiste gown: Cap sleeve, inset bodices, val lace trim.

Pink and white were made and most likely there is a green, blue and lilac as well.

The fancy Bed Jackets were available in the same array of colors. A great mix and match selection to go with the delicate print Batiste gowns.

How do you know if it is real? **Were TL PJs placed in a JL package?**

What criteria do you use to make the determination?

Here is what I do:

1. Look at my reference material – Monthly Booklets and Catalogs
2. Review the past issues of the Daisy Chain - Aug 2006 was the PJ Convention issue.
3. Review all my photos from our 2006 Convention
4. Review my “What Shall I Wear Today” binder by M. Weaver
5. Call an expert

When these 1st appeared in 2010, I questioned - IS IT REAL? Now in 2024 a second pair has appeared with Embroidered Tag (1955-56 era), the 1st pair found is a Printed Tag (1952 era).

Why was this simple pair of PJs snapped for TL in a JL package? TL pjs

always had a bow. Other questions I had in 2010 were:

Is the elastic at the waist the same as other TL garments?

Dennis keeps reminding us: “Boys to the right, girls to the left”?

Is the self binding at the neck sewn the same as other PJ’s

Would the hem be top stitched?

Are the sleeves too long?

Is this fabric used on other TL garments?

Is it made with the attention to detail we expect?

In 60 years could a TL pair of PJ’s be placed in a JL package?

It is tagged but does that mean it is TL?

Would the longer sleeves give me a hint as to era?

Did JL’s have longer sleeves?

This set of PJs continues to be a mystery... Photo at top of page snaps for TL while the dressed doll at right is truly for Jerri.

The new assumption is that we have a matched pair of TL and JL PJs and that the above MIP was TL pjs (missing her bow) in a JL package. AND that the real JL pjs are once again united on a JL doll!





1952-53 Nightwear – Cotton PJ & Wool Gabardine Robes

Sleepy Time also promoted cotton PJs and Wool Gabardine Robes with felt Lambs. Or, if you were lucky enough a monogrammed "T" or "J".

The Cotton PJs for TL or JL listed @ \$1.75. Bunny Slippers @ \$.85. Wool Gabardine Bathrobes @ \$1.95. Jerri's Robe always came with a self-fabric belt.

The number of prints seemed to be unlimited. JL Tops most often had buttons while TL tops had a single square snap. Please remember tops closures – girls to the right, boys to the left.



If you attended the 2006 San Antonio Convention there was a display of 125 different PJs, Nightgowns, Robes and Bed Jackets.

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In the 1954 Fashion Parade offered for sale is Jerri in his Masquerade costume. It's a cute, one-piece suit that makes him look like a circus clown. In 1956 Vi takes the costume in another direction and calls them "clown pajamas." Pictured on the same page as Jerri's masquerade costume – clown pajamas are for both Terri and Jerri. Even Tiny Terri is pictured wearing them in the 1955 & 1956 Tiny Terri fashion Parade. The back cover of the May 1955 Monthly Magazine shows Jerri in a lesser seen fabric with lines that run through the seer sucker fabric with brightly colored animals scattered in the pattern.





I've been wondering....

Why didn't Tiny Jerri Lee have pajamas, other than the "jungle jammies" which he had to share with his sister Tiny Terri? I bet Tiny Jerri and Tiny Terri had a little trouble getting to sleep with that big cotton ruffle around the neck.

It snaps at the back and ties in the front.

The 1956 Fashion Parade has two new items for sale. The housecoat in the middle was for sale in the 1954 Fashion Parade. On the right is #5606 Nitie. It's a Shortie Nitie. Which is great for those hot California nights. In the 50's many of us didn't have air conditioning in our homes and the shortie nitie was wonderful to wear. The cost was \$1.75. The nitie slipped over Terri's head making it easy to put on. Lace trimmed the nitie with a bow on the left side some came with rosettes in the center of the bow. Below are two samples.



The nitie on Terri is made of nylon, while the MIP nitie is a crinkle cotton.

Advertised between 1948 and 1952 the bunny slippers were sold to accompany both Terri and Jerri Lee pajamas and nities. The style of slippers changes in the 1954 Fashion Parade. Bunny slippers could be purchased separately for \$.85 or in sets.

What is interesting is the variations of faces painted on the bunnies or the lack of. While I believe there was a sample for those constructing the bunnies to follow the faces were left up to those finishing the slippers.

The June 1948 issue of Jr. Magazine advertises Bunny Slippers of white felt, with faces and pink ears, I found no reference to when the red ears might have been made. Dennis Ross has a pair of pink felt bunny slippers in his collection. The variations are out there you just need to look as not all bunnies are the same.



3. Rich cranberry red velvet set, flowers on mittens match coat, one flower has a petal nipped. \$70




4. Snowsuit, red lined jacket, red pants, cap, galoshes and mittens \$55

6. Dark brown velvet with leopard print hat and collar - collar needs snaps. \$55



7. Dark brown velvet coat with white fur cap and collar - collar needs snaps to stay around neck properly. \$55



8. Coral red velvet coat, hat, felt/fur galoshes and felt mittens, mitten flowers match coat color. This style has the collar down the back in a V. I carelessly got the cap lining wet and stained it. \$60
